COURSE CURRICULUM

WEEK 1: AN OVERVIEW

Module 1: Overview of Ageing

As one ages, we may experience a variety of physical, physiological and psychological changes. In this module, you will learn the common illnesses associated with ageing and how to adapt to your loved ones as they age.

Module 2: Monitoring of Vital Signs

Regular monitoring of the elderly shealth vitals is important for chronic disease management and early diagnosis of health complications. This module teaches you how to monitor vital signs and what to do when readings are abnormal.

Module 3: Emergency Management

In this module, you will learn to identify health warning signals and how to react in emergency situations such as falls and injuries.

WEEK 2: ASSISTANCE WITH ACTIVITIES OF DAILY LIVING (PART 1)

Module 4: Exercises for Older Adults and Fall Prevention

Exercise can help seniors prevent immobility and maintain proper muscle and joint function. In this module, you will learn the common types of exercises for older adults, the causes of frailty in the elderly and how to prevent falls.

Module 5: Mobility & Ambulation

In this module, you will learn to care for clients on mobility aids/devices or who are bedbound. These include using and evaluating the use of walking aids, assisted lifting, transfer and positioning techniques.

Module 6: Personal Hygiene & Grooming

As seniors age, they may require assistance in maintaining their personal hygiene and grooming. This training will cover the practical skills including performing oral care, continence care, assisted bath and basic urinary catheter care.

WEEK 3: ASSISTANCE WITH ACTIVITIES OF DAILY LIVING (PART 2)

Module 7: Elderly Nutrition & Feeding

Seniors require a balanced and nutritious diet for healthy ageing. They may also require special diets or tube feeding if they have difficulty chewing or swallowing. This lesson covers the nutrition requirements and diet management for seniors, and how to apply different types of diets and feeds for the elderly.

Module 8: Administration of Medication

Most seniors take multiple medications simultaneously to treat different medical conditions. Hence, it is important to know how to help them administer their medication properly and avoid some of the common medication mistakes. In this module, you will learn the 5 rights of medication administration, common medication errors and how to use a pill box to effectively administer medications.

WEEK 4: TECHNIQUES FOR EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION & MANAGING CAREGIVER STRESS

Module 9: Communicating with Elderly Clients

Seniors may be slow, forgetful, temperamental and stubborn. Learn how to manage seniors by understanding their underlying medical problems and behaviour and engaging them through effective communication methods.

Module 10: Managing Caregiver Stress

This module teaches you how to identify signs of caregiver stress and how to manage such caregiver stress when caring for an elderly who is chronically ill.



HOW THE COURSE IS CONDUCTED

Online course:

There are online video lectures (conducted by a senior nurse, speech therapist and physiotherapist) which you can view at your own time before the online group sessions.

On the evening of the group session, all the cohort members will meet via a Zoom call to participate in the class activities, share their experience and have their questions answered by a nurse.

At the end of 4 weeks, we will have a face-to-face practical session to give you all hands-on practice on transferring and diaper changing/bed bath skills before a practical assessment.

Classroom course:

The class (inclusive of assessments) will be conducted at our office.

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COURSE CURRICULUM

MODULE 1: SIMPLE WOUND CARE MANAGEMENT

You will learn the causes of pressure injuries, its risk factors and the staging of pressure wounds. You will also understand the purpose of wound dressing and how to implement simple wound dressing techniques which can be applied to pressure wounds as well as clean wounds.

MODULE 2: NASOGASTRIC TUBE FEEDING

In this module you will learn the purpose of enteral feeding, different types of enteral milk feeds, how to perform tube feeding including the safety precautions to take. You will also learn how to schedule enteral feeds and address common issues associated with enteral feeding in a home care setting.

MODULE 3: INSULIN INJECTION

In this module, you will understand why insulin is adminstered to diabetic patients. You will also learn the types of insulin, correct techniques and five rights of administering an insulin injection, and proper method to dispose the insulin needles and syringes in a home care setting.

MODULE 4: RESPIRATORY CARE

Patients with respiratory problems like chronic obstructive lung disease as well as stroke patients with drooling and impaired swallowing are some of the patients who would benefit from oxygen therapy and oral suctioning. In this module, you will learn the purpose of oxygen therapy and oral suctioning, how to use the equipment (oxygen concentrator and suctioning machine), as well as the safety precautions and infection control measures when performing the procedures.

MODULE 5: STOMA CARE

A stoma is an opening on the abdomen that is connected to the intestines to allow waste to be removed from the body. In this module, you will learn the anatomy of the stoma, the reasons for stoma and their complications. We will also share the types of stoma, pouching systems, and how to drain and change the wafer and stoma bag. Finally, we will discuss the common problems associated with stoma and how to prevent them.

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
